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Introduction

The Global Academy uses the Gatsby Benchmarks as a guide to plan our Careers and Industry programme. See our Careers Programme for full details.

As part of our commitment to informing our students of the full range of employment, learning and training pathways on offer to them - we are happy to consider requests from training, apprenticeship and vocational education providers – particular with a media or creative industry focus, to speak to students.

This policy statement sets out the Academy's arrangements for managing the access of providers to pupils at the Academy. This complies with the Academy's legal obligations under Section 42A, 42B, 45 and 45A of the Education Act 1997; Section 72 of the Education and Skills Act 2008 and Schedule 4 (15) of the School Information (England) Regulations 2008.

The policy is updated in line with the updated Careers guidance and access for education and training providers legislation released in January 2023.

As a minimum, schools must offer:

- Two encounters for pupils during the 'first key phase' (year 8 or 9) that are mandatory for all pupils to attend, to take place any time during year 8 or between 1 September and 28 February during year 9 this is not applicable to Global Academy UTC as we start our education at Year 10.
- Two encounters for pupils during the 'second key phase' (year 10 or 11) that are mandatory for all pupils to attend, to take place any time during year 10 or between 1 September and 28 February during year 11.
- Two encounters for pupils during the 'third key phase' (year 12 or 13) that are mandatory for the school to put on but optional for pupils to attend, to take place any time during year 12 or between 1 September and 28 February during year 13.

Student entitlement

- As part of our unique approach to careers education Students in years 10-13 are entitled to
 find out about apprenticeship, employment and alternative technical training opportunities as
 part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and
 training options available at each transition point. (end of Year 11 and end of Year 13).
- Global Academy fully complies with the new legal requirement to put on at encounters with providers of approved technical education qualifications or apprenticeships

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- To hear from a range of local and national providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships through options evenings, assemblies and group discussions and taster events.
- To understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.
